The Caucus is an organization of black members of the Association which seeks to enlarge the numbers and roles of black economists and to advance knowledge and understanding of economic questions particularly relevant to black people and other minority groups.

### **ASGE Program Note—Grants Economics**

The AEA, the ASA, and the Association for the Study of the Grants Economy (ASGE) are jointly sponsoring sessions on grants economics—the emerging subdiscipline of "welfare economics of interdependence." Grants economics is based on the assumption of interdependence of consumers utility functions and a systemic view of the roles of grants as cybernetic regulators of the exchange economy. Furthermore, it attempts to evaluate the economic and social effects of transfers with the help of a set of value axioms consisting of efficiency, growth, stability, equity, security, freedom, integration and system maintenance.

This leads to concepts of "general efficiency" as the basis for the evaluation of economic and social welfare policy. One of its major and most immediate emphases is on the equity implications of public policy instruments, which—explicitly or implicitly—serve to generate unequal transfer benefits to different groups in society.


The Financial Management Association will hold a national organization meeting in Cobo Hall, Room 3037 at 4:30 p.m., December 28.
