American Economic Association Adds Three Years of Online Access for Subscribers

NASHVILLE, TN – The American Economic Association (AEA) is pleased to announce that it has added three earlier years of online access to the *American Economic Review (AER)*, *Journal of Economic Literature (JEL)*, and *Journal of Economic Perspectives (JEP)* for its online institutional subscribers. The 1999-2001 issues include reference linking, cited-by links, and other features that have been available for AEA issues since 2002.

Access will be available to library users as part of their current online subscriptions. "We are including the additional issues in online institutional subscriptions at no extra charge, said Drucilla Ekwurzel, Director of Publication Services." With references linked to full-text articles and cited-by links to more recent articles, the additional issues will make it more convenient for economists to follow an author's published work."
