

Instructions:

1. There are three separate data files, all formatted for STATA use. “1910 IPUMS base sample for table one.dta”, “MatchedSample.dta” and “1930 IPUMS Comparison for table two.dta”
2. Tables in the main text of the paper can be replicated using do file “Main Paper Tables.do”. This file will rely on all three data sets listed above to generate the results.
3. Tables in the Supplement to the paper can be replicated using “Supplemental File Tables.do”. This file will rely only on the “MatchedSample.dta” data file, but will reference five “Adjustment Table” files.

More on the “Main Paper Tables.do” file:

4. For Table 1 in the main text, the 1910 IPUMS sample, including both matched and unmatched individuals, must be merged into the matched sample utilized for the core analysis in the paper. The coded 1910 IPUMS sample is “1910 IPUMS base sample for table one.dta”. The main file for analysis is “MatchedSample.dta”. The 1910 IPUMS file is incorporated into the matched sample file in the first few lines of “Main Paper Tables.do” and Table 1 can be generated using lines 1-88 of the “Main Paper Tables.do” file.
5. For Table 2 in the main text, the 1930 IPUMS sample of implied migrants is compared to the sample of matched migrants. The two samples are appended, not merged, for this exercise. (Matched migrants cannot be identified in the 1930 IPUMS file.)
6. Tables 3-7 rely only on MatchedSample.dta and are generated using lines 157-344 of the Main Paper Tables file.
