General disclosures

Trust funds for the JSDF (Japanese Social Development Fund) and DFID (UK department for International Development), executed by the Indonesian Ministry of Education and the World Bank respectively, supported the preparation and the implementation of this research. None of these donors has been actively involved in the design, implementation or analysis of this study. The Ministry of Education further supported this research by devoting staff time to it. The design was decided together by the Ministry of Education and the World Bank, and the Ministry of Education implemented the intervention in close collaboration with the World Bank. The data analysis has been done by the authors.

The research project did not apply for IRB funding because the intervention was implemented under direction of the Government of Indonesia.

An earlier version of this paper was published as a World Bank Policy Research working paper; no. WPS 5795 and thus was peer reviewed, received clearance from the World Bank Indonesia Country director and was discussed with counterparts at the Ministry of Education in Indonesia. This submitted version has undergone substantial revisions compared to the working paper and has not been reviewed by the World Bank.
