AMERICAN INDIAN CASINOS AND THE RISE IN NATIVE AMERICAN

SELF-IDENTIFICATION

This paper explores the dramatic rise in individuals identifying as Native American by linking

individual racial self-identification with the opening of American Indian casinos at the state level

over time. We find that the opening of the first tribal gaming casino in a state is associated with

an increase in the probability that individuals with American Indian ancestry will self-identify as

Native American. Moreover, these effects increase over time and are driven in part by the likely

payment of casino dividends to tribal members. Our results point to the importance of economic

incentives underlying the individual choice of racial identity.
