Financial Disclosure for the paper: "Immigrants' Effect on Native Workers: New analysis on Longitudinal Data"

I am disclosing in this statement the financial support I have received for this project and related projects since this project was initiated in 2011. Most of the research was carried out during my time as PhD student at the University of Copenhagen.

As a PhD student I received a research grant from the Danish Economic Policy Research Network (EPRN) in 2011 titled "The Task-Specialization Hypothesis and Possible Productivity Effects of Immigration?" for an amount of DKK 240,000 (USD 35,000) to work on this project. My travels to UC Davis were also supported by a travel grant from Augustinus Fonden DKK 15,000 (USD 2,100).

I have received two research grants in 2014. An individual postdoc grant from the Danish Council for Independent Research to the project "Organization of Production, Product Variety and Immigration" DKK 1,784,699 (USD 258,600) and a new EPRN grant titled "Immigration Laws and the Performance of Immigrants" DKK 272,198 (USD 39,500).
