This paper was produced as part of the World Bank impact evaluation project South Africa Youth Job Search Assistance (P154307).

This research was jointly funded by the World Bank Africa Gender Innovation Lab, World Bank Jobs Multi-Donor Trust Fund (MDTF), National Science Foundation, Private Enterprise Development in Low Income Countries initiative, W. E. Upjohn Institute for Employment Research, and the Global Challenges Research Fund Accelerating Adolescent Achievement Hub. No funder was entitled to review or alter research findings.

The Harambee Youth Employment Accelerator provided access to data and funding for implementation as part of its normal operations, but provided no funding for research.
