## Using open educational resources from the Federal Reserve to teach Money, Credit & Banking

Money, Credit, and Banking is an upper-level economics course that has been historically taught with mainstream textbooks. In an effort to find more cost-effective options and current content, a decision was made to pursue open educational resources.

The US Federal Reserve System, including the district banks, provides an extensive library of educational tools authored by their team of researchers. These resources, consisting of videos, podcasts, and articles were deployed in the Fall 22 Money, Credit, and Banking course to support existing content. Student learning outcomes were measured compared to the Spring 21 section. Student learning improved and costs were reduced. Overall, this was a successful adoption of new content.
