CURRENT RESEARCH I study the impact of pension systems in economies with informal labor markets. When the government can only regulate the formal sector, payments to social protection programs are only mandatory for workers in formal jobs. Thus, contributions to a pension system impose a liquidity constraint on workers in the formal sector. I develop a heterogeneous agent life-cycle OLG model where informality arises endogenously as workers choose their optimal working sector.
