## 1 Gallup and GSS Data

This paper uses data extracts from Gallup and the General Social Survey (GSS).

**Gallup Data:** Gallup surveys are available from [Roper Center](#) to those with institutional access. **Reading\_Ascii\_Gallup.do** includes the dictionaries for samples with our key *black president* question. For most other Gallup datasets we utilized we read in only race, age, state and party.

**General Social Survey:** Basic GSS data are available on their [website](#). In order to obtain state identifiers, we additionally applied for the restricted access GSS. Consult the [GSS Documentation](#) for directions on how to obtain the geographic identifiers.

### 1.1 Cleaning

1. The program **Reading\_ASCII\_Gallup.do** imports Gallup polls (from the iPoll databank in ascii format) into Stata. It creates *gallup.dta*.
2. Using *GSS7212\_R6.dta* (raw data from GSS), the program **Cleaning\_GSS.do** creates *GSS\_keyvar.dta*.
3. Using *gallup.dta*, the program **Cleaning\_Gallup.do** appends *GSS\_keyvar.dta* and other relevant variables. It creates *gallup\_and\_GSS\_extrayears.dta*, which is later used in the analysis. It also appends data from presidential approval and political parties, we only provide dictionaries and do files that create the following data sets:

5. Additionally, we include the auxiliary program **make.gallup.cen.wgts.do** that matches data with census values (IPUMS data). We also include **gallup.gss.add.truman.svy.dates.do** that adds in missing svy\_date observations for Truman-era Gallup data (with dates taken from the iPoll website).
