For the experiments conducted in Maastricht approval for the collection of human data has been obtained of the director of the Behavioral and Experimental laboratory (BEElab) at Maastricht University at an ethics review and project proposal meeting that is required for all experiments conducted at the BEElab facilities. All participants were informed that they were free to withdraw from participation at any time. Individuals invited to the experiment previously voluntarily registered in the BEElab database. Informed consent was indicated by electronic acceptance of an invitation to attend an experimental session. The voluntary registration in the electronic database documents participants' acceptance. At the time the experiments were run Maastricht University did not have an IRB.

For the experiments conducted in Zurich the project received the approval of the IRB of the Faculty of Economics, Business Administration, and Computer Science of the University of Zurich.
